

## Explore Social Justice through Experiential Activities

**This one-day workshop introduces the use of experiential activities to address social justice issues and promote dialogue and reflection.**

Participants will experience an interactive activity-based approach to develop self-awareness and agency, with workshop time to develop next steps. Focusing on methods, terminology and activities, participants will have the opportunity to increase their “toolbox” for diversity and/or social justice related content (anti-bias, inequity, discrimination, prejudice, and oppression).

### **Participant Outcomes:**

- Exposure to social justice concepts, terms, and resources
- Practice in dialogue and skillful discussion around sensitive issues
- Increased knowledge of experiential learning activities that can promote dialogue around social justice issues

Tara’s passions include facilitation and training in adventure and social justice.
